
REO titers for the last 4 years in GA

We have observed an increase in reovirus associated field problems in GA breeders and broilers, and have isolated many different reoviruses from birds affected with tenosynovitis. Some companies started vaccinating their breeders with autogenous reovirus vaccines over the last few months, as the regular vaccines did not protect against the new field strains of reovirus. Coinciding with the publication of the biennial GA titer report, we decided to look at reovirus titers over time in broilers and the publication of the biennial GA titer field should be allowed in head and the little protection.


and breeders. As predicted, all titers are on the increase reflecting field challenge in breeders and broilers and/or hyperimmunization of the breeders.




GA Day old REO titers in Broilers
