

## What does this mean?

The AAVLD Accreditation is based on ISO 17025 requirements, which is a comprehensive laboratory inspection and accreditation program encompassing all laboratory disciplines including necropsy, histopathology, bacteriology, serology, and virology.

AAVLD Accreditation does not certify a product or service. It signifies that a laboratory adheres to a documented process and quality controls in conformance with ISO-based international standards that contribute to high quality, safety, reliability, and consistency of services to ensure customer satisfaction.



## Why is this important?

AAVLD Accreditation provides a very recognizable credential that demonstrates intent to manage quality through practices deemed acceptable by ISO. A lot of testing that GPLN does is depended upon for live poultry and poultry producer movements within the US and internationally. We get inquiries from our trade partners about our accreditation status, and they expect this official recognition.

In addition, this accreditation opens the door for different levels of funding, but most of all, working towards this accreditation makes us a much better lab.
