
Avian metapneumovirus has taken the poultry industry by surprise earlier this year by causing egg production drops and respiratory signs leading to neurological signs from secondary bacterial infections. Luckily, the number of cases has slowed down over the summer. However, beware! This virus survives better in the cooler and wet environment as we are about to step into the colder season.

With the investigations GPLN completed recently on saved sera, we have evidence of the establishment and circulation of the virus in the Georgia chicken population. With the goal of monitoring the exposure of flocks to the virus for the upcoming seasons, we are adding the mean titers for aMPV per Georgia region on the website! This new feature is added in November 2024 and will be updated monthly.

Have a look, and let's continue to keep up our biosecurity!


